Palmetto Bluff owners that are SCYC members had a lovely representation this year with 8 participants to round out our field of 24.

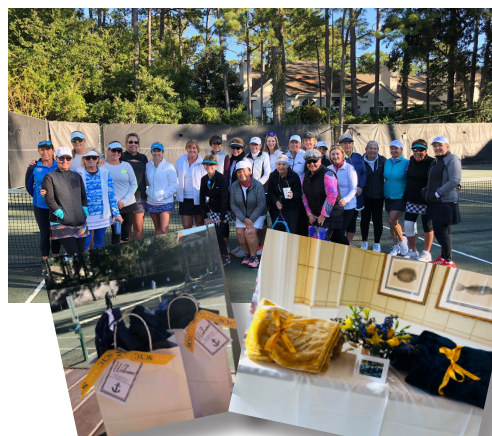

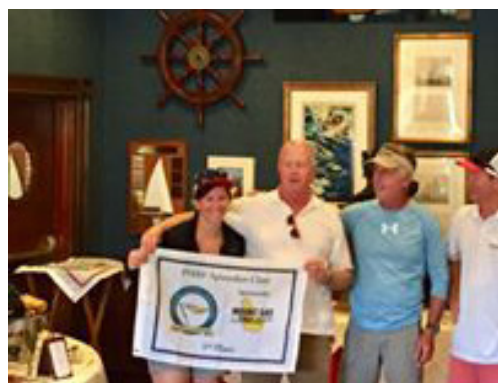
