



# Yachting Log

## THE 30TH OCEAN CHALLENGE REGATTA

SCYC's 30th Annual Ocean Challenge Regatta was held the weekend of October 9 – 10 in Calibogue Sound. This year's event was an all SCYC affair with One Design fleet racing exclusively for Harbor 20 keelboats, and all crews being regular participants in the weekly Wednesday afternoon racing.

There were 8 boats racing on Saturday and 9 on Sunday, including the newest boat in Harbor 20 Fleet 3, Perigon, owned and skippered by new member Gerry Migliaccio with Phil Rogers as crew. Perigon is also one of the newest Harbor 20's anywhere, having been delivered in August from the new manufacturer, after production was suspended for several years due to a dispute about design rights. We are proud to have her in Fleet 3 (sail number 703).

Weather conditions were troubling initially, after almost a week of continual rain, but while there were ominous looking clouds from time to time, there was no rain or thunderstorm and, in fact, both days ended up with beautiful white cloud filled skies.

The wind was something else entirely. Both days it blew steadily from almost directly due north, from about 10 to 14 knots,

diminishing in the later afternoon. High tide was within about an hour of the start each morning so we had strong wind blown chop, especially Saturday morning, making for quite a wet day going upwind, though less so on Sunday.

Race Committee of Carter Minnich Principal as Officer, ably assisted by the Club's General Manager, Michael Clarke and with Richardson Group COO, Lee Lucier on the mark boat, all did a great job running 6 races on Saturday and 4 on Sunday. The start was set square and with the northerly wind the course was straight up and down the ICW. Racing was challenging not only from the wind and waves but because Race Committee, taking advantage of the wind direction, set an exceptionally long course (compared to weekly racing). Each race was long as well, 4 legs in two windward-leeward laps, requiring about 35 - 40 minutes sailing time to complete, each leg being about 5/8 of a mile in length.

With crew on each boat all being experienced racers racing was close and competitive. The average score for the average boat for 9 races (with lowest score of 10 thrown out) was a 4, right in the middle of the fleet. First Place (15 points) was taken by Slingshot (Domenico De Sole; Peter Gamble skipper); Second (21 points) by

Running Tide (Eric Norman, skipper with Creighton Stuckart and Wyatt Norman alternating as crew; and Third Place (24 points) went to Noseeum (Joe Highsmith, skipper with John Potter).

Other sailors and boats were David and James Thurlow (Quadrille), Isabella Thurlow, Eleanore De Sole and Ann Rinaldi (Norsewomen), Peter Brower and Todd Sargent (Rooster II), Mark Brown and Marion Gilchrist (Courageous), and Gordon Miller and Robert Cunningham (New Blue).

Congratulations to the winners and all the participants. And thanks to the Race Committee as well as to JR and Leslie Richardson for contributing the mark boat and Jeff Sikes his Boston Whaler as Race Committee boat.

# Through the Grapevine

Starting with a wonderful Miso Glazed Black Cod, Baby Bok Choy and Roasted Morel Mushrooms paired with a 2019 Sauvignon Blanc.

This rich intriguing and Sauvignon Blanc exemplifies why Paso Robles has emerged as a leading appellation for this Bordeaux variety. classic enticing nose of gooseberry and lemongrass anticipates tempting notes of pineapple, kiwi and grapefruit. Suggestions of lime zest, quince and acacia flower round the aroma profile. The palate is clean, lively and elegant, exuding mouthwatering flavors of juicy pineapple, green apple, kiwi and melon. Lingering notes of key lime, white peach, dragon fruit and citrus persist through a long and lovely finish.

Our Second Course: Butter Poached Alaskan Halibut over Sage Polenta with Garlic Scented Haricot Vert paired with a 2020 Daou Discover Chardonnay.

The 2020 Chardonnay presents luscious aromas of pineapple, pear and Granny Smith apple with appealing hints of lemon chiffon,

nectarine and honeysuckle. As the experience unfolds, the nose further reveals hints of star jasmine, nutmeg and vanilla bean. The palate is plush and graceful, offering mouthwatering flavors of peach, mango, kiwi and fresh Crenshaw melon. The rich fruit is perfectly complemented by suggestions of lemon zest and baking spice, while a voluptuous finish lingers with notes of pineapple, guava and hazelnut.

The 3rd Course: Chocolate Bread Pudding with Mint Cream paired with a 2019 Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon.

The classically styled 2019 DAOU Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon showcases Paso Robles as a world-class region for Bordeaux-style wines. It opens with a highly perfumed nose of black cherry, mulberry, plum and Oregon blackberry, all underlain by notes of cassis, kirsch, licorice, and crushed gravel. Secondary aromas of dark chocolate, coffee and dried sage reveal an elegant complexity. On the palate, it is powerful, balanced and brimming with layers of fruit and spice. Tempting flavors of Zante currant, boysenberry and black plum anticipate accents of cigar box, mocha, crushed herbs and pencil

shavings. Firm, fine-grained tannins provide ample structure to support a lengthy finish of sweet cherry, leather, toasty oak and vanilla crème brûlée. In the end, the 2019 vintage is nothing short of an immensely approachable wine that will age with grace and refinement.

#### **NOVEMBER**

In November we will experience Wines from Merryvale Vineyards.

Merryvale's proprietors, Schlatter Family, are winemaking traditionalists with a deep respect for Napa's winemaking legacy and a dynamic vision for the future of Napa Valley. They are preserving the committed to history without winery's rich compromising their forwardlooking plans. Working closely with Winemaker Andrew Wright, they have sharpened their focus on Bordeaux varieties, the wines for which Napa is most renowned.

Below are the wines we will enjoy:

### Sauvignon Blanc

Complex aromas of tropical fruits, wet stone, and honeysuckle. The classic barrel fermentation and élevage in neutral French

oak provides generous texture combined with vibrant focus. An incredibly fresh, pure, and precise Sauvignon Blanc that showcases piercing acidity with layered balance. Enjoy now and over the next several years, as this style of Sauvignon Blanc can age beautifully.

### Chardonnay

The goal for this wine is finesse and complexity which is enhanced by using long, slow, native fermentations. From the Napa side of Carneros, Chardonnay is a beautiful golden color. The nose opens up with roasted almonds and evolves to floral and fruity notes including bergamot, pineapple, ripe peaches and citrus. In the mouth, the entry is very round and fresh with an abundance of fruit flavors. The acidity is very soft, and guided by the minerality, all supporting a lingering finish.

### Pinot Noir

This highly pleasurable, hedonistic Pinot Noir explodes out of the glass—pure fruit, unrestrained from a warm vintage, yet fresh from early

overnight harvesting. The palate is supple and generous, layered with black cherries, baking spices, and cola. Brambly and delicious, long and evolving.

### Cabernet

The wine opens with abundant dark fruit on the nose such as plum, blackberry and cherries, with a touch of leather and graphite. In the mouth it starts with lively acidity that brings a freshness to the wine, then it evolves on soft tannins and a very velvety texture—already showing great! There is a lot of tension and drinkability with this wine at release so it can be enjoyed immediately. The blend is comprised of 77% Cabernet 13% Sauvignon, Merlot, 6% Malbec, 4% Cabernet Franc.
