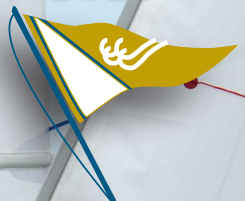

Club Activity Report

Happy New Year, SCYC! I wanted to let you know that our team is very optimistic about 2020 being a fantastic year. In 2019 we were able to make substantial capital improvements to our club. A new Brazilian wood deck, posts, rails, and lights were installed. The awnings on the rear of the building have been replaced. The outdoor teak furnishings has been stripped and sealed. Two new docks have been constructed and installed on either side of the face dock. The formal chairs in Catesby have been reupholstered. The carpet in Catesby and Trophy has been replaced. Our COO Lee Lucier has been integral in overseeing the construction of a beautiful Compass Rose mosaic that will be installed this week. Both men's urinals have been updated. The settee in the women's restroom has been reupholstered. At the Sports Center the pool bar was updated with fans and exterior lighting. The poles on the tennis courts were removed and replaced with brand new ones. The courtside coolers were all updated. The courtside water dispensers were all replaced with new ones. Last Spring we pulled up the old lines and put down new. This year we took back over maintenance of the tennis courts which has saved the club a considerable sum.

This year we brought on an additional tennis professional Patrick Walker. Going into 2020,

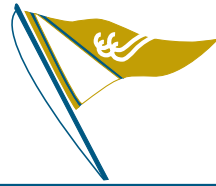

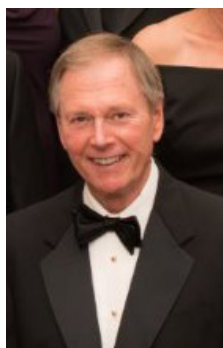

The second area that I identified to helping us achieve our financial goals is the growth of our tennis program. We have two outstanding tennis professionals on our team in Denise Agee and Patrick Walker. I anticipate that

we should see tremendous growth in our summer tennis program. The hope is that this will ultimately drive our membership enrollments. Patrick Walker is a highly skilled player that should make an impact in the Summer Pro League this year. That kind of exposure is invaluable.
